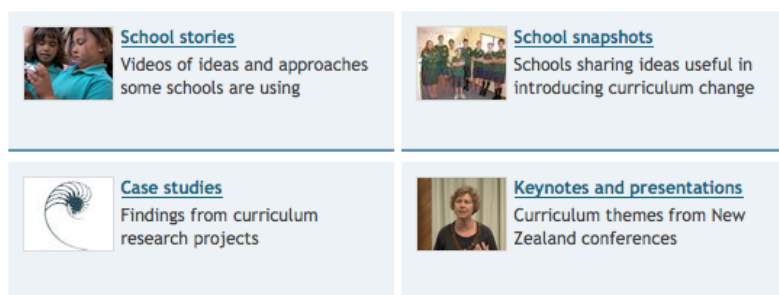


## The New Zealand Curriculum Online – Digital stories



Throughout the development of the New Zealand Curriculum, and now during its implementation phase, school leaders and teachers have expressed a need to find out how others are approaching school curriculum design.

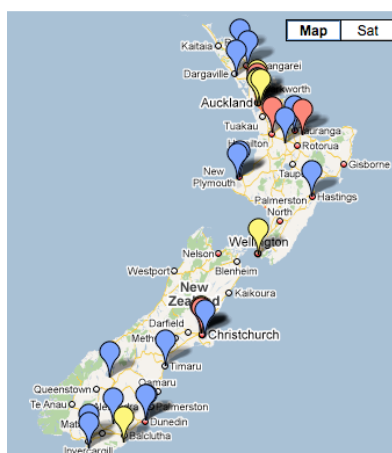
The [digital stories](#) section of the site houses an ever-growing collection of videos and print stories created by students and teachers, and by NZC Online staff members working alongside schools. Every school curriculum development is unique, and these schools have generously shared their experiences in the hope that some of their ideas may be useful to others who are also reshaping their school curricula.

The [school stories](#) section contains videos of schools discussing curriculum. On each video page you have the option of viewing the video on line or downloading it to your computer for viewing offline. There is a text transcript and also some review questions to spark staffroom discussion.

### [Story 19: Living the principle - Te reo me ōna tikanga at Rotorua Boys' High](#)



Rotorua Boys' High School illustrates how embedding te reo me ōna tikanga Māori throughout the school provides a framework for successful teaching and learning. The teaching of te reo Māori is inseparable from tikanga, and other programmes being offered by the school are Māori centered.



The [school snapshots](#) include text-based stories. There are three navigation options: the Google map enables you to see at a glance where the snapshots come from. Just click on a pin to get to the snapshot. This is handy if you are looking for examples within your own region or if you are planning a fact-finding trip to a particular place. Alternatively, find the schools and their snapshot themes by scrolling down through the table under the map, or the alphabetical list of schools in the left menu.
