
FOCUSING THE INQUIRY ON STUDENTS NOT MEETING THE EXPECTED LEVEL

Identify Year 2 students not making expected progress. Considering the best fit standard, identify these students' strengths, needs, and next steps for learning, e.g., Hemi is one of a group of students who have been in Year 2 for two terms and their progress most closely matches the standard after one year at school. What do you need to plan in order to accelerate Hemi's and this group of students' progress to meet the after two years at school standard?
