National PLD

RAPs (Regional Arts Partnerships) full day workshops

The aim of these workshops is to offer PLD support for middle leaders and teachers-in-charge of all Arts learning areas. The second round of workshops will cover the following;

- Embed the new NCEA aligned Level 3 achievement standards
- Use assessment practices that are consistent with The New Zealand Curriculum i.e. integrated programming

Regional PLD

Arts clusters

Separate Dance, Drama, Music and Visual Arts Clusters will continue as a key part of the overall PLD. This will look different for each region and each discipline.

The focus will be on key teaching and learning issues around the NZC and standards alignment. These clusters will most probably continue with meetings once per term.

Focused Arts support (cluster +)

There is an opportunity for working with your school as a follow up to something that arises in a cluster or workshop. This must be based on a needs analysis and have an outcome of the PLD that can be evaluated.

In-depth school support

In-depth school support will be provided to schools referred by the local Ministry of Education office. This is a change this year in that schools must approach their local office of the Ministry of Education and request in-depth support, rather than just arrange it directly with the PLD provider. Most of these schools have been contacted and initial scoping of data and areas of need have begun. Facilitators will be working in these schools starting term 3 2012

Costs

There will be no charge for this PLD, as it is centrally funded by the Ministry of Education.
