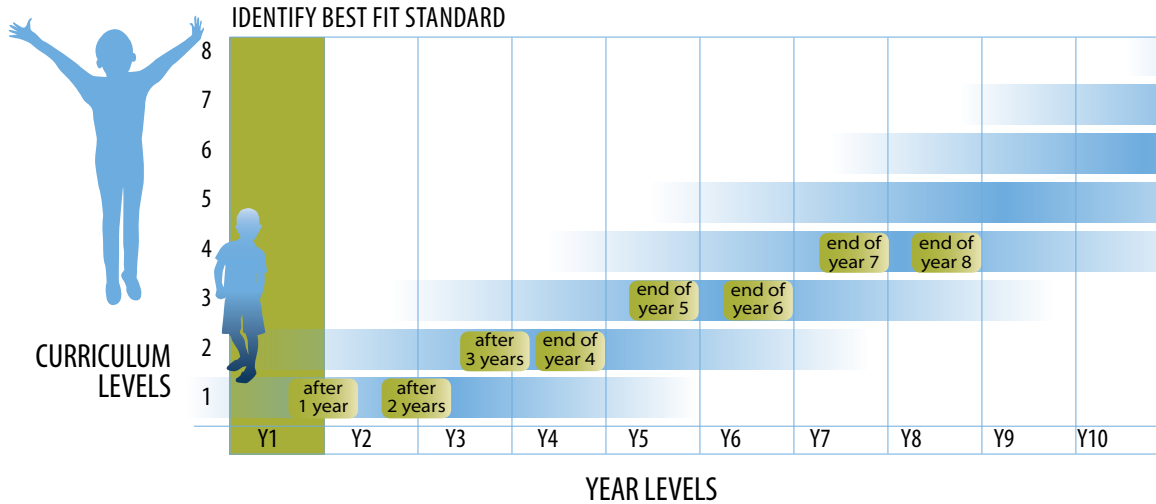




FOCUSING THE INQUIRY ON STUDENTS NOT MEETING THE EXPECTED LEVEL

Identify Year 1 students not making expected progress. Considering the best fit standard, identify these students' strengths, needs, and next steps for learning, e.g., Theo is one of a group of students in Year 0 who are making slow progress after six months at school. What do you need to plan in order to accelerate Theo's and this group of students' progress to meet the *after one year at school* standard?
